## Demands for Racial Justice in Ridgewood Public Schools

Working Towards Desegregated Access to Education & Schools That Uplift, Support, and Welcome BIPOC Students and Staff

- 1. We demand RPS work to actively combat interpersonal racism through a combination of anti-racist trainings for teachers and students, and the implementation and enforcement of anti-racist rules and regulations.
- 2. We demand RPS work with antiracist curriculum experts to dismantle the Eurocentric curriculum by:
  - a. Introducing more Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) sources/perspectives
  - b. Teaching histories of colonialism and racism in the US, NJ and Ridgewood, with an emphasis on genocide and human rights violations perpetuated by the state
  - c. Addressing Eurocentric biases outside of the humanities (i.e. in STEM classes)
- 3. We demand RPS hire and retain more Black teachers, aids, staff and leadership in RPS.
- 4. We demand RPS remove barriers for marginalized students across race and socioeconomic status by ensuring equity in economic access to course material, academic support, extracurriculars, and sports opportunities.
- 5. We demand RPS undertake a third-party, holistic audit in which it evaluates curriculum, learning outcomes, educational and extracurricular experiences, and other related indicators to evaluate the ways that racism affects RPS.
- 6. We demand RPS create and maintain an office of diversity that can aid the district in implementing the reforms listed, support students of color, and ensure RPS's long-term commitment to antiracism.
